Dear parents and carers,

Therapeutic Approach to Behaviour

I start by sharing information about the recent staff training the school team has been involved with. As you know we are a Thrive school and we follow the Hertfordshire Steps model to support pupils who display behaviour concerns.

Mrs Kenny and Miss Dodwell have been delivering training to update and enhance staff awareness of positive behaviour management.

The approach allows opportunities for pupils to self-reflect and make amends when they have made poor choices. It allows them time to think about how they have acted, even by being a bystander to a negative incident. Therapeutic Thinking encourages empathy and a shared way of speaking to one another so that unwanted behaviours are de-escalated as we carefully choose a resolution, facilitated by an adult.

Please continue to support the work we do in school by talking to your child about embracing the values of the Golden Rules so that we can aim to have Ready to Learn and Respectful times at school.

Golden Rules

In Highwood Primary School we implement Golden Rules as a reminder to always follow the Golden Rules and use as the guidelines for behaviour and actions in school and at home.

- Do be gentle.
- Do be kind and helpful.
- Do be honest.
- Do work hard.
- Do look after property.
- Do listen to others.



Planning and managing children's behaviour creates a link between children's mental health and behaviour. (See DfE White Paper: Mental Health and Behaviour in Schools November 2018).

By working in partnership together we will ensure through pro-social behaviours:

- **We all have the right to feel safe**
- **We all have the right to work and learn**
- **We all have the right to be respected**
- **We all are responsible members of our school community**

We will continue to bring children's attention to ways to self-regulate and keep calm. Please look at the following resources that we use in school. Attendance

We are sure that you will have seen that school attendance is in the national news headlines. Schools are responsible for working with families to set clear expectations regarding attendance and for working with families to reduce any barriers to non-attendance.

In the coming weeks, Mrs Edmunds and I will be holding a meeting with the Hertfordshire Attendance Improvement Officer to discuss the school data on attendance and punctuality. There will be a discussion about holidays taken during term time. We will need to discuss how many

children are away from school on the last few days of each term and / or the first few days of each new term. Our Attendance Improvement Officer is the expert in this area, and she will offer further support when attendance or punctuality falls significantly. Hertfordshire Attendance officers are also giving more guidance to schools about the use of fines in some circumstances where reasons for absence straddling holidays cannot be verified.

Although our attendance figure is slightly above the national figure currently, we still remain aspirational. Our improvement actions are:


Develop a strong focus on attendance so that all learners have above-average attendance, aiming for the aspirational target of 97%.
