Dear Parents and Carers,



With the end of the term fast approaching and the festive feeling across the school, we have been continuing our learning with enthusiasm and curiosity. Pupils have started to perform at the Christmas special events.

Pupil Voice: The theme of this year's 'Anti-Bullying Week' was called 'Make A Noise About Bullying'. The overriding theme shared and promoted across the school during this designated week was "to not be silent about the hurt that bullying can cause, or to remain silent when we hear bullying just dismissed as 'banter'."

At Highwood, we endorse this sentiment wholeheartedly, and have further promoted the values of unity and respect by running a poster competition. Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors (ABA) have been working hard to encourage and support their peers to be kind and empathetic towards each other. Our ABA's meet regularly to address actions about how we can create events throughout the year to continue to raise awareness and combat any form of bullying (physical, verbal, relational or cyber) across our school community. Our ABA's are extremely keen to support their peers in their roles this year.

As you know, our school is a very diverse community. Promoting key values, such as respect, is extremely important and will continue throughout specific PSHE lessons, circle time and assemblies. With the work of our school ABA's, and valuable discussions around this important theme, we want to make a noise about bullying, and racism and decrease the impact that it has on society.

Autumn Term Assessments

We have carried out some initial analysis of attainment data and can see that there has been significant academic progress this term. We continue to refine our methods to find out how much pupils can remember and recall in their learning.

The Maths Mastery Approach to teaching maths is making a difference, resulting in children recalling number facts fluently. Please encourage your child to read every day and complete their Reading Record. We know that more effort needs to be applied in writing from Year 1 to Year 6. Children need to build their stamina to write longer pieces of work. In the spring term, we aim to focus on skills of editing, proofreading, and reflecting upon what has been written. Our school improvement advisor will be visiting the children in January to observe and delve into what each year group should be able to do independently.

Mistakes that pupils need to spot:

- · Capital letters in places they are not needed
- · Missing capital letters at the beginning of a sentence or the name of a person or place
- · Misspelt words
- Missing words
- · Punctuation in the wrong place or missing
- Mixing up punctuation
- · Sentences that do not make sense when you read them

In the meantime, we will advertise for a music specialist to help with the music teaching. We will continue to follow the National Curriculum and teach it ourselves, as are many schools having to do nowadays.

Mrs Nicolas' passion for music spread cheerfulness across the school. She is very much missed and we wish her all the best for the future.

Due to Mrs Khindey leaving for her new Headteacher post, I am pleased to announce that Mrs Thompson and Mrs Gerrald, our senior leaders, will be stepping into the succession planning roles of Acting Assistant Headteachers. The governors and I felt that their successful experience working at Highwood made them very worthy of interim appointments. Miss Marriott and I will support them in their new roles, which will continue to focus on raising standards of teaching and learning. They will continue to teach in their respective phases, but they will have additional strategic roles of responsibility. We also look forward to Mrs Woodward joining us in January. She is an experienced, enthusiastic teacher who will work closely with the senior leaders.
