## Writing Review with School Improvement Advisor

Last Wednesday, the school undertook a writing review with our school improvement advisor. The visit was positive from Early Years to Year 6. Pupils at all ability levels were engaged and working hard to achieve the learning objective of the lesson or through child-initiated learning. There were good teaching strategies such as partner talk, careful explanations offered and excellent scaffolding support of writing on flipcharts pads. Later during the visit, selected pupils spoke about their English, reading, and writing. It was marvellous to observe the children speaking confidently about how adults help them to extend their vocabulary, check and edit their writing, and when they are unsure about objectives, how they are given time to revisit their learning.

We have revised the Marking, Presentation and Feedback Policy and will ensure it continues to be embedded in our teaching and learning, as there was variation and inconsistency in some pupil exercise books.

next week, it is really important to chat with your children on an ongoing basis about staying safe online. Not sure where to begin? These conversation starter suggestions can help;

2. Ask them about how they stay safe online. What tips do they have for you, and where did they learn them? What is OK and not OK to share?



3. Ask them if they know where to go for help, where to find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block on the services they use.

4. Encourage them to help someone! Perhaps they can show you how to do something better online or they might have a friend who would benefit from their help and support.

5. Think about how you each use the internet. What more could you do to use the internet together? Are there activities that you could enjoy as a family?
