Personal, Social and Emotional Development


In Reception we will be continuing to develop friendships within our class and be talking about the Highwood golden rules. We will building on our previous learning and practising our skills in turn taking and sharing ideas.

Jigsaw Jenie will be helping us to talk about how to stay healthy. We will be looking at eating healthy and how to keep fit. We will also be discussing why it is important to wash our hands and keep clean.



Literacy

This term we will be focussing on different creatures. We will be using lots of story language and new vocabulary. Here are some of the books we may cover.







Mathematics

In maths, we will be looking at our numbers from 5-10. We will be exploring the composition of these numbers, the different parts added together to make the numbers.

Also looking at patterns within the number system such as, odd and even numbers.



Understanding the World

We will be thinking about the lifecycles of plants and frogs. Hopefully, we will visit the pond and see if we can find any tadpoles.



We will be thinking about different festivals and celebrations including Ramadan, Easter and Mothers' Day.



We will be looking at different creatures including dinosaurs. We will be finding out more about them and investigating fossils.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be learning about Henri Matisse. Exploring collage. Looking at his paintings and making our own versions.



We will also be looking at dinosaur fossils and creating our own versions of this, using salt dough sculptures.
