### Science: Materials

Go on a hunt around your home. Make a list of all the objects you find and the materials that they are made of.

e.g. Table → Wood



### Challenge:

What is the most popular material found in your home? Why do you think your home is made from bricks and not straw?

**Instruction writing:** We will be learning about writing instructions. Write your own instructions for a topic of your choice. You could write your own instructions for Pancake Day, for getting ready for school, looking after a pet (real or imaginary), making a model, making your favourite meal or baking favourite cakes.



**Challenge:** Use as many bossy verbs as you can. Can you start each instruction with a different one? E.g. slice, cut, chop.

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### History: Find out all about the new King.

Who is the King?  
What is his favourite animal?  
Who is in his family?  
Where does he live?  
What does he do?



**Challenge:** Create your own Royal Fact File on the Queen and show us how you celebrated the King's coronation.

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**R.E:** In class we have been talking about our special objects and how we would feel if we had to give them up for love. Talk about things that are special to family members. What are they? Why are they special? How would they feel if they had to give them up for love?

**Challenge:** Draw a picture of your families favourite items, write why they are special to them.

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**Problem solving 1:** Using only the digit cards shown, how many different ways can you make the totals shown on each dice? You can use addition and subtraction.

**Challenge:** Using your own dice roll another 2 numbers.

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**Reading:** Make a poster recommending one of the 100 Best Books to display in your classroom or the school library. Make sure you include:

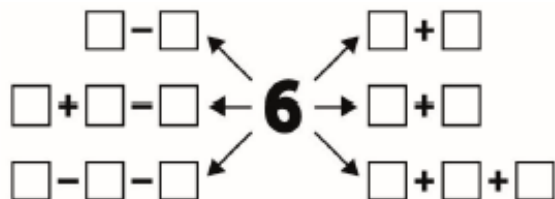
1. What makes the book so interesting?
2. Who might like the book – what age?
3. An eye catching illustration

**Challenge:** Read the books you have left on your Reading Passport.

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**Problem solving 2:** How many ways can you make 6 using addition and subtraction?



**Challenge:** Select another number. How many ways can you make this number?

**Music:** Find a simple song that you know well. Listen to it a few times and sing along.
