English

Read Write Inc.

Children will take part in daily Read Write Inc. The Phonics Screening Check will take place

during the week beginning 09.06.25.

All children must be in school for this week. Read Write Inc books should be brought to school every day. These will be changed within their RWI groups.

Science: Seasonal Changes

The children will be learning about seasonal changes. They will be taught the following key knowledge and skills to help them answer our Big Question: Is it always sunny in the Summer? Pupils are taught to:

- ask simple questions and recognise that they can be answered in different ways.
- observe closely, using simple equipment.
- perform simple tests.
- identify and classify.
- use their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.
- gather and record data to help answer questions.
- name four seasons and identify when in the year they occur.
- observe and describe weather in different seasons.
- describe days being longer in summer and shorter in winter.
- present data in tables charts and compare seasons.

History - Toys



The children will be taught key knowledge and skills to help them answer our Big Question:

How are our toys different from those in the past?

- Understand and use the words past and present to discuss an event.
- Recognise the difference between past and present in their own and others' lives
- Use stories to encourage children to distinguish between fact and fiction.
- Begin to use sources to identify some details and answer simple questions.
- Compare adults talking about the past how reliable are their memories.

DT - Cooking and Nutrition



In DT we will be working towards creating our **Big Piece: A Healthy Snack**

The children will be taught the following skills:

- Investigating fruit and vegetables and generating ideas; communicating through talk and drawings.
- Using simple utensils and equipment.
- Tasting and evaluating user's preference.
- Understand where ingredients come from.

PE - Net and Wall Games



In our PE lessons we will be working on our ball skills. We will be learning how to:

- physical: throw, catch, hit a ball, track a ball
- social: support others, work safely, communication, co-operation
- emotional: perserverence, independence, determination
- thinking: comprehension, select and apply, reflection, identify areas of strength and areas for development, decision making

RE – Is Shabbat important to Jewish children?



- Retell the creation story and how it relates to the Sabbath.
- Explain how Shabbat is celebrated.
- Talk about why a Jewish family might go to a synagogue to celebrate Shabbat.
- Say what day might be special to me and explain what I might do on that day and whom I might spend it with.
