




This half term the children will be reading these key texts:




They will be producing the following pieces of written work linked to the key texts:

Newspaper reports and persuasive leaflets.



- Measures Compare, Estimate
  and Calculate
  - Discrete and Continuous Data
    - Division
    - Perimeter
    - Properties of shape

#### **Science: States of Matter**

The children will be taught to the following key knowledge and skills:

- compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases
- observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)
  - identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.

#### **Geography - Europe**

The children will be taught key knowledge and skills to help them answer our Big Question:

# Where are the European cities and why are they located where they are?



They will look at primary and secondary sources to help them locate European cities. The children will use their knowledge of biomes to describe climates in Europe.

#### Big Piece – Designing and making our own bread.

This half term, the children will explore **food technology** (linking with our Geography topic) and will be learning skills linked to making bread.

The children will learn how food is reared in the UK and the wider world, how to use a variety of techniques using kneading and baking and to bake a product using a heat source. We will also look at how to make a workspace hygienically safe to prepare food and how to season our product.





In our PE lessons we will be learning the following key skills when participating in a variety of activities:

- Begin to order instructions, movements and skills.
- Explain why someone is working or performing well.
  - Explain what I'm doing well.
- To explain what I am doing well and to identify areas for improvement.
  - Understand ways (criteria) to judge performance.
- Use awareness of space/others to make good decisions.

The children will be learning about Sikhism to help answer our Big Question:

P.S.H.E- 'Dreams and Goals'

This half term, the children will learn about:

- Hopes & dreams
- Overcoming disappointment
- Creating new, realistic dreams
- Achieving goals
- Working in a group
- Celebrating contributions
- Resilience
- Positive attitudes.



We will be learning about Sound and will create our own music and scores to create a short piece of music to accompany a film.

As part of our e-safety learning we will be focusing on sharing information and protecting such information.



The children will learn about rhythms and polyrhythms whilst listening to and learning about the music of Spain and specifically the rhythms of the *Habanera*, learning to play it before creating their own arrangements.



#### On y va!

The children will learn the names of some francophone countries and some towns in France. They will also learn different modes of transport in French and say how they would travel to a Frenchspeaking country.
